

## FAQs about St. Patrick's Day Dance

Q. Is this a family-friendly event?

A. No, this event is for adults only.

Q. What do people generally wear?

A. The dress is casual.

Q. What do we need to bring?

A. We serve a traditional corned beef and cabbage dinner with potatoes, carrots, and soda bread. We provide utensils, plates, cups, ice, soft drinks, and hot coffee. Many people choose to bring appetizers for their parties. Alcoholic beverages are BYOB. Please drink responsibly and have a designated driver.

Q. When do the doors open?

A. The doors open at 6:30, dinner starts at 7 p.m. Dancing starts at 8 and ends at midnight.

Q. Where can I buy a ticket?

A. Tickets are on sale at Goffstown Ace Hardware, Vikster's Pizza, and from Main Street volunteers. Leave a message at 497-9933, and someone will direct you to a ticket source.

Q. What else is going on at the dance?

A. There is a silent auction of items donated by our community. You may pay by check, cash, and we also take Visa and Mastercard.

Q. Who is the Grand Leprechaun?

A. The reigning Grand Leprechaun is Karen Henderson. This tradition goes back to the original St. Patrick's Day Dances hosted by The Gaelic Society. Previous grand leprechauns include Hank Boyle, Robbie Grady, Mike French, Bruce Normand, Mike Walton, Judy DesMeules and Larry Brown. The reigning Grand Leprechaun nominates the next one for their service to our community.

Q. What are the proceeds spent on?

A. The proceeds from the evening go into our general fund to support our economic revitalization efforts.
